

This cooperation originates from discussions between members of NATO School ADL Office and (Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies) DRESMARA Information Technology (IT) Office, held during several PfP ADL Working Group meetings.

The ADL Cooperation will benefit the Alliance and Partner Nations, support the aims of the NATO School and Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies, and disseminate knowledge and experience among interested participants.

3. Contents of the ADL Cooperation

This Technical Agreement aims to formalize and strengthen ties between the NATO School and The Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies at NDU in Romania. This partnership pertains only to the Advanced Distributed Learning (ADL) Office and includes the following aims and commitments:

3.1. Aims and Commitments of the NATO School:

Specific terms

The NATO School ADL Office has developed the ADL modules for the “**Resource Management in NATO**” online course and will co-brand the product together with the Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies.

General terms

For the course(s) produced, the NATO School ADL Office will act as a liaison between the Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies and the ADL Partners and will remain as the Point of Contact (POC) or project coordinator.

All ADL courses produced and/or updated between the NATO School ADL Office and the Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies will be labeled as co-owned ADL courses and described as a mutual effort between the NATO School ADL Office and the Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies. The Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies and The NATO School will remain the content owners. The content provided by the Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies must support the NATO School resident course and comply with NATO standards. NATO School Course Director and OPR remain involved in the course update to ensure the ADL course meets the NATO requirements. The Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies can add any further content to the ADL course which is of interest to their students and offer a broader view on the topic, but it must be obvious for the learner which course parts are reflecting the NATO view on Resource Management.

NATO School ADL Office will support the creation of a special section on the PfP LMS and/ACT LMS called “NATO School - Regional Department of Defense Resources Management Studies course”. The ADL course will be placed both on the Partnership for Peace (PfP) Learning Management System (LMS) and on the National Defense University “CAROL I” LMS.
